The program explores developments in the biochemistry of addiction and addictive behavior.

FETAL ALCOHOL SPECTRUM DISORDER—PARENTING AND CAREGIVING

38. Redefining success : raising children exposed prenatally to alcohol [Videorecording]

Shows five families in British Columbia who adopted children prenatally exposed to alcohol. Medical professionals, teachers, support groups and advocates are represented in segments of the video. The video shows the range of effects of prenatal alcohol exposure on the children's development, behaviours and needs at different ages. It also shows that the impacts are largely invisible, which may add to some of the children's and parents' difficulties and frustrations. The children talk about their experiences and feelings regarding their triumphs and difficulties.

The video explores some of the myths and stereotypes that have historically been attached to children and youth exposed to alcohol. It also shows that a range of approaches is needed in parenting children prenatally exposed to alcohol. The families in this video show that successful adoptions happen when there are redefined expectations of all family members. Success is redefined in terms of valuing different qualities, achievements and abilities.

In a joint investigation with MTV, this 48 hours broadcast focuses on Troy Swett, a young man who, ashamed of his \$300 - a day habit, confessed his addiction and underwent rapid detox at the Waismann Institute. The program also reports on 13-year old Shauna Ulman, who, after taking what she thought was ecstasy, died of an overdose; it debates whether OxyContin is addictive when used as prescribed; and it tracks the rise in theft of OxyContin from pharmacies and patients. Some content may be objectionable.

Over the course of the filming, two of the children relapse badly, one ends up using again and working on the streets to support her drug habit; while a prosecutor's son ends up serving time for a robbery. It is the courageous and chilling story of parents who are struggling to keep their children alive and in treatment, while at the same time trying to change public policy to end the futile war against drugs.

Using sophisticated 3-D animation, this program, divided into two parts, takes viewers on a journey deep into the brain to study the effects of the three substances.

The first part illustrates the major functions of the brain and shows how its principal cells, the neurons, communicate with each other through electrical and chemical signals.

In the second part, animated molecules of nicotine, cocaine, and marijuana travel a route from the external of these drugs, and how each drug interacts with them and subsequently affects the body. Images of actual neurons used in the animations create a realistic effect that helps viewers understand the concepts presented. The DVD comes complete with a Teacher's Guide that includes suggested presentation methods and an assessment activity.
