Dean Wilson used to be an IBM salesman. Now, as president of the Vancouver Area Network of Drug Users (VANDU), he is the most politically outspoken drug addict in Canada. Ann Livingston, a non user, is the charismatic co-founder of VANDU. Dean loves Ann. But he is also a captive of the drugs he uses. Together, Ann and Dean lead an unpredictable crew of street addicts in their fight to open North America's first safe injection site. They find a curious ally in Philip Owen, the conservative mayor of Vancouver who rejects the US-style War on Drugs. Instead he champions a controversial European approach called Harm Reduction which includes safe injection sites. Opposed by members of his own party, the Mayor stakes his political career on Harm Reduction. The drug users say they are staking their lives on it. Fix follows these real life characters for two years as their stories interconnect in a battle for the hearts, minds and streets of a city each one calls home.

A culturally diverse group of seven high school students meets with members of the Odd Squad-Vancouver police officers who, since 1998, have been filming people addicted to drugs.
