Like a quarter of Vancouver's homeless youth, Melo and Ti-criss came from Quebec. They're seeking escape, adventure and maybe the meaning of life, but for now, their only certainty is love.

From east to west, from the streets to a hotel, with a welcome interlude in the country, they seek their place in society but often find only boredom. Getting high doesn't always chase away the tedium.

After a life of hard knocks and wounds from a painful childhood. Ti-criss chooses his ultimate solution: suicide. From this shocking end, Melo emerges bruised but stronger. In this unsettling look at youth living on the edge, the filmmaker acknowledges street kids for who they are and treats them with the humanity they deserve.

Dean Wilson used to be an IBM salesman. Now, as president of the Vancouver Area Network of Drug Users (VANDU), he is the most politically outspoken drug addict in Canada.

Ann Livingston, a non user, is the charismatic co-founder of VANDU. Dean loves Ann. But he is also a captive of the drugs he uses. Together, Ann and Dean lead an unpredictable crew of street addicts in their fight to open North America's first safe injection site.

They find a curious ally in Philip Owen, the conservative mayor of Vancouver who rejects the US-style War on Drugs. Instead he champions a controversial European approach called Harm

Reduction which includes safe injection sites. Opposed by members of his own party, the Mayor stakes his political career on Harm Reduction. The drug users say they are staking their lives on it.

Fix follows these real life characters for two years as their stories interconnect in a battle for the hearts, minds and streets of a city each one calls home.
