**Cruel spirits : alcohol and violence (ajfe)**

A narrator outlines the violent results of alcohol abuse as the situation is documented with scenes from street fights, prisons, hospital emergency rooms and shelters for abused women and children. Results of experiments at Kent State support the argument that alcohol consumption stimulates violence and aggression.

**It's not only murder : discovering the violence in your life (amaz)**

That violence is more than murder – that it's anything that hurts someone – comes as news to most kids who don't see the harm in behaviour that's all too typical, from sarcasm and spreading rumors to sexual harassment and bullying. Here teens talk about how subtle and pervasive violence can be, how it starts, how it escalates and spreads, how to stop it, how to avoid it, and how to break the cycle that threatens their future.

**Non-violent crisis intervention – Volume 1 : the preventative techniques (aivn)**

Unfolds the actual behaviours an individual will display while escalating toward a violent episode and provides the insight and techniques you need to prevent situations from escalating to a more difficult and more dangerous level.

**Northwestern Canadian conference on family violence (akpt)**

Recorded May 1996, this video deals with violence in families in the Aboriginal community and features Judge Murray Sinclair as speaker.

**Rape drug, The : a new menace (akxq)**

This program examines the growing use of the drug Rohypnol to sedate women in order to take sexual advantage of them on dates. It follows two such cases through interviews with victims and their attorneys. The drug, both odourless and flavourless, can be mixed with alcohol and renders the victim easy prey for her attacker. Available in 64 countries, the drug also leaves its victim with complete or partial amnesia, making prosecution of offenders nearly impossible.

**Right from the start (aixr)**

Through a series of scenes depicting an abusive relationship in various stages of development, the video shows how possessive and controlling behaviour can escalate into physical threats and violence. Young viewers learn how to avoid being abused, how to avoid abusing someone, and how to support a friend in trouble.

**Violence prevention ; inside out (aqfi)**

Grades 7 – Sr. 4; 20 minutes

Through narration, interviews, and dramatization, the video examines the feelings inside oneself leading to and resulting from violence, and violence experienced externally in the home, school, society and environment in general.

**Part 1:**

Understanding Violence: defines violence, showing the role of feelings in violent behavior, e.g. feelings of frustration, loneliness, sadness and particularly anger.

**Part 2:**

Preventing Violence: discusses prevention of violence, focusing on the consequences of violent behavior, the importance of dealing with anger and other feelings, and the role of alcohol, drugs and guns and gangs in the cycle of violence.

Part 3:

Coping with Violence: is a guide to coping with violence, emphasizing the importance of basic safety strategies and conflict management including mediation skills. It addresses the role of stereotypes – sexual and racial – in the perpetrators of violence.

**When dating turns dangerous** (akpu)

This video illustrates how sex trade recruiters lure teens away from friends and family, gain their trust, then force them into often violent life on the streets – sometimes in only 24 devastating hours. A useful tool for teachers, counsellors and youth groups wanting to explore and address this issue.
