### History

In 1980 an amalgamation with the former library of the Alcohol and Drug Education Services resulted in an expanded AFM Library named after William Potoroka, a well-known Manitoba educator in the alcohol and drug abuse field. By 1983 the library contained the largest collection of current materials in addictions in the province of Manitoba.

### What does the AFM Library offer?

This specialized library offers resources on addictions and related topics. It offers the full range of library services to the public. Membership is free and available to all Manitobans over the age of 18.

The William Potoroka Memorial Library is the most comprehensive information source on substance use and misuse, gambling and related issues in Manitoba, offering up-to-date, reliable information on issues, trends and research in the addictions field.

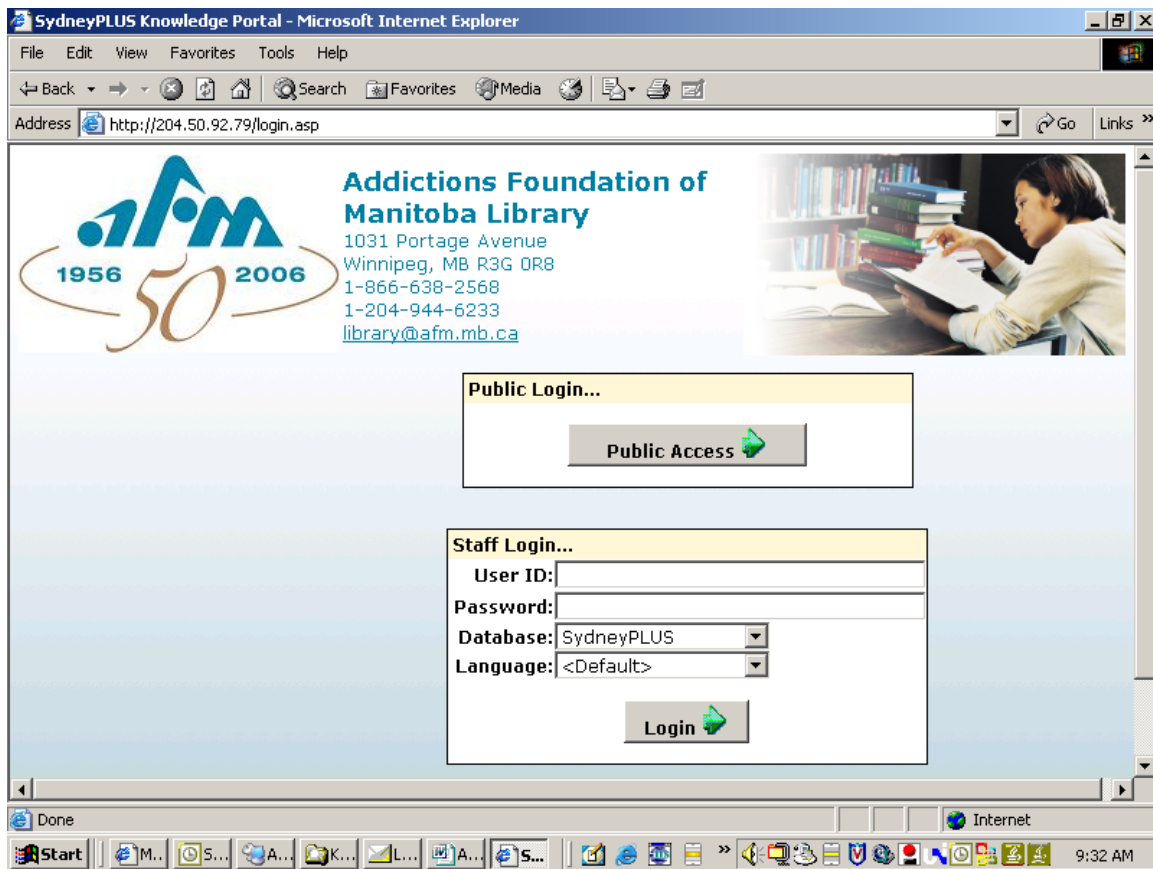
### What topics can be found in the collection?

- Alcohol, other drugs and gambling
- A wide range of compulsive behaviours including smoking, sexual addiction, internet addictions, eating disorders, etc.
- A wide range of related issues such as anger, stress, depression, suicide, communication, self-esteem, parenting, domestic abuse, co-occurring disorders, impaired driving, etc.
- Resources on or about special populations: seniors, women, men, children, youth, families, employees, etc.
- Manitoba's largest collection of Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder resources.

### What types of resources can be found in the collection?

- Audio-visual resources—videos, DVDs, CD-ROMs, kits, demonstration tools, audio-tapes, etc.
- Books—self-help resource, research reports, government documents, statistics, etc.
- Journals—academic and professional
- Brochures, booklets, fact sheets and posters
